


## Thresholds

Now you've chosen how you want your doors to open, you can decide how you would like your threshold to be. Would you like it flush with the floor? Are you happy to have a step over? Most people prefer to keep the threshold as low as possible minimising the divide between the inside and the outside whilst some people have their own reasons to prefer to keep the step.

An examples of this has been where we have installed the doors into a garden that has a tendency to flood in extreme weather conditions, in this case they decided to have the standard fully weather rated threshold with the step over. This gives an extra 75mm from the ground level before water could get in. Another other option we do is the low threshold, this isn't weather rated and in extreme weather conditions, some water or wind could penetrate through. People that tend to have this threshold have bi-fold doors that are quite well protected and sometimes even sheltered. They also tend to have guttering along the front of the threshold as an added security measure. The low threshold is much easier to install with the low finish, however the standard threshold can be sunk into the floor to create the same low, even flush finish.
